Due to her terrific attitude, wiliness to try, and fabulous, ready smile, 7-year-old Sophia was awarded GMTRC's 2018 Janelle Conley Award. Sophia first came to visit the barn with her family as a 2 year old. Her parents were seeking an activity to help Sophia's physical, social and cognitive development, since she has cerebral palsy, with some effects to her hearing and speech. At that time, she was still too young to ride, but by 4, she was riding Hobbit and telling her parents that she wanted to win a big award at our annual party, "Celebrate GMTRC." Her mom reminded Sophia to keep trying to do her best in the saddle, and surely her dream would come true. Try she did!! Wow, we are incredibly proud of her!

Sophia represents GMTRC's ridership well. She loves having a sport to call her own, a kind pony

that provides steady movement to challenge her body and mind, a knowledgeable, fun-loving instructor in Katie Gingrich, and long-time volunteer side-walkers who ensure her physical safety while providing consistent social support in lessons. Through trail rides, games, challenges and scavenger hunts in the arena, Sophia is making gradual progress. Riding doesn't feel like a "workout," but her weekly lessons stretch her tight leg muscles, help her to sit up independently, and challenge her coordination. Every year, Sophia looks forward to riding in GMTRC's annual Horse Show, where she can demonstrate her accomplishments to a cheering crowd. Clearly that ready smile reflects how much fun she is having at GMTRC!



Board of Directors Note: Tom O'Brien


