Meet this issue's featured rider: ANDREW! Andrew has been a part of GMTRC's Family since 2007. It's no surprise that riding comes naturally for him. This teenage equestrian comes from a horse-loving family. His mother was a fox hunter and owned horses. His sisters, Sarah and Hannah, used to ride in family rodeos.

Andrew, who will turn 20 this August, has worked with several GMTRC horses over the years. He rode Rascal, Hobbit, Bailey, Nando, and Wiz before making his way to Sampson. Nancy, Andrew's mother, says Andrew loves Sam's unflappable personality. "He loves the horse," she says. "Sampson is very calm, and it's given Andrew a lot more confidence."

Through his therapeutic riding at GMTRC and his work with Fitness 4 Focus in East Petersburg, Andrew has developed core strength and balance. He is working on his goal of riding off-lead. His instructor, Linda, says he has made tremendous progress.

According to Linda, "Andrew is a charming young adult with a deep love for riding and for Sampson. A few years ago, Andrew held some physical and emotional tension and fear when riding. We used creative horseback games and humor to reach his new-found confidence and maturity in the saddle. Today he truly feels responsible toward his leadership and partnership with his horse. He has developed in balance, stability, and strength. Andrew can process and navigate walk patterns off-lead...and reverse the patterns! He loves a trail ride in the fresh air and helping to remove and store his horse's tack each week."

After a year away, GMTRC is thrilled to welcome special groups back to the barn!

#### **Aaron's Acres Returns!**

Starting on June 22nd and running six times this summer, Aaron's Acres will return to the barn for its annual summer partnership.

Aaron's Acres participants will enjoy riding, grooming, and leading the horses. They will also experience sensory activities through handling tack and completing a scavenger hunt all while learning



about horses and horsemanship.

Risa Paskoff, Aaron's Acres Executive Director, says "everyone at Aaron's Acres is beyond excited to be returning to our in-person camp program this summer, which includes our trips to Greystone Manor Therapeutic Riding Center! There is nothing better than to see one of our campers getting on a horse—

whether it for the first time or for the 10<sup>th</sup> time! The staff at GMTRC are patient and kind as they help to support each child to ensure a safe, positive experience! We are counting down the days!"

This summer's visit with Aaron's Acres will be a new experience for GMTRC Program Director Stephanie Fleck, who says "we are thrilled to have the campers back on the property. We look forward to witnessing the physical and emotional interactions the campers will have when they encounter a horse."

#### Silver Saddles Comes to GMTRC

GMTRC is excited to partner up with the Pathways Institute for Lifelong Learning to pilot a new program called "Silver Saddles!"

The program launched on May 24th with the first four participants working with instructors Deb, Linda, and Steph at

the barn. The unique horsemanship program features four weekly unmounted sessions in which participants age 55+ experience the incredible bond between humans and horses while also enhancing physical and cognitive stretching and strength, facilitating positive exchange of experiences, and considering future equine opportunities. The current session will run through June



21st. A second session will begin with four new students on Tuesday, September 14<sup>th</sup>.

## Outreach—Heather

On Wednesday, April 21st, GMTRC's Outreach Coordinator delivered a speech to long-time supporters, the American Business Club of Lititz (AMBUCS), to share the positive difference their financial support has made to the organization over the years. Pasture management is critical to equine health. GMTRC's staff carefully monitors the amount of grass each of our horses consumes every day. To this end, in late 2019, GMTRC started adding fencing to pastures "A" and "B" thanks to a grant from the Donald B. and Dorothy L. Stabler Foundation.

This summer, GMTRC will be able to add additional fencing to pasture "B" thanks to a grant from the Robert J. Gunterberg Charitable Foundation, further aiding the management of the horses' diets.
