

Volunteer Profile: Phyllis Spotts

How did you learn about GMTRC? My daughter grew up riding and being involved in a local 4-H horse club and I heard about them then. So years later I felt that I wanted to do some volunteer work and decided to find out about therapeutic riding.

When did you become a volunteer? I have been volunteering since 2006.

Why did you become a volunteer? I have always enjoyed being around any animal. I thought if I could help someone also enjoy being around an animal, therapy for us both!

What activities do you do in the barn? I started as a volunteer side walker on Thursday afternoons in 2006. After a couple years I wanted to learn more about the care and handling of the horses. That's when I started helping with barn duty.

What about this experience has been rewarding for you? The most rewarding thing for me is helping with the riding lesions. A rider can arrive for a lesson and be frustrated and stressed but leave smiling and loving their horse. I really appreciate how the instructors teach the riders and the volunteers to breathe and be calm. Every rider is different and the instructors are very knowledgeable on what methods to use to help each rider learn something new or improve on each week.

What would you say to someone who is considering becoming a volunteer at GMTRC? You will be rewarded far more than you can imagine. There are many ways to volunteer, just try it. Leave your daily stress outside the barn door and focus only on the job you volunteer to do.

Is there anything else you would like to add? The instructors, riders and their families always appreciate what you do for them. You will always leave feeling like you received more than you gave and you will make some very important friends.

Participant Spotlight: Vicki Maiers

Vicki Maiers joined GMTRC through the Silver Saddles program. She stayed on as a volunteer and horse sponsor. We thank Vicki for sharing her story with us!

How did you learn about GMTRC? I learned about GMTRC when I saw your article in the Lancaster Newspaper advertising your Silver Saddles program. I thought, "gee that would be amazing if I could actually get in." I have always loved horses and was fortunate to have my own horse way back when I was just out of high school. When I went on your website to research how to apply for Silver Saddles, I saw that I could also apply to be a volunteer. I thought that would also be a really great opportunity to share my life with horses, so I immediately applied.

What made you decide to try the Silver Saddles Program? I felt that the Silver Saddles program would be an excellent way to spend time with horses and expand my knowledge about them. Silver Saddles gave me the opportunity to learn so much about horses, how to communicate with them, how they perceive us as humans, how they actually see and what their field of vision is, how they tune in to our energy, and "how to raise and lower our energy as needed."

Why did you become a volunteer? I became a volunteer because of my love of horses, and I felt the opportunity to care for them would be extremely rewarding. To say the least, it is the most rewarding experience in my life. I recently became a widow, and spending time at the barn and giving the horses the love and care they need has been so uplifting.

What activities do you do in the barn? When I arrive at the barn, I like walking along all the stalls and turning on all the stall lights. I usually bring in three or four horses depending on how many volunteers we have. After they are all in, we clean their hooves. Then I tend to the pasture water troughs. If, for some reason, the horses couldn't go out because of the weather, the duties could be different, and we would muck stalls. On Saturdays, when time permits, Terri lets us groom horses.

What about this experience has been most rewarding to you? It is the highlight of my week, as I get to groom Lil Lacey. The most rewarding experience of my barn duty is caring for and sharing love with the horses.

What would you say to someone who is considering volunteering or starting programming with GMTRC? I would say to someone that was considering volunteering, if you have a passion for horses, go for it! You will find it to be very rewarding as you get to know so many people at GMTRC. Through Silver Saddles, I had the opportunity to get to know Steph, Kristina, Deb, Linda, and many more wonderful people. It is like a happy family at the barn, and I welcome the opportunity to be a part of it. I can't say enough about Terri. She does an excellent job of training people to care for the horses and has an amazing knowledge of each horse. I also want to express my great love for Lil' Lacey. I am happy to have been able to adopt her and contribute to her care. I look forward to seeing her every week and being able to groom her and give her my love. Animals give us unconditional love and deserve nothing less in return. Thank you, once again, for giving me this opportunity to share with all of you!
