


You Belong Here Too!

Up Next: Electric Panel Upgrade!

Technology has come a long way in the last 64 years, but our facility electric system has been left to collect dust—literally! For the first time in barn history, we are having our electric system upgraded and having new wiring placed between the barn and our pastures!

This large project, slated to take place the last week of March, is being made possible due to gifts from the High Foundation, the Clark Associates Charitable Foundation, and the Robert J. Gunterberg Charitable Foundation.

The new electric system and wiring will reduce our chances of having an electric-related fire and protect

our team, volunteers, horses, and participants from electric shock.



All of them had worked hard to build an exceptional program.

As we continue to identify and address new needs in the community, our need for long-term sustainable funding also grows. Program fees only account for about 25% of our operating revenue. The rest is left to fundraising.
